Fee Match Program Available For New or Expired Memberships

CO-OPP is aware that many of our Chapter members have faced financial hardships related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Also, many agencies and entities do not currently have funding to subsidize the costs for CO-OPP membership for their employees. The Board would like to retain our valued members, and continue to offer them the benefits of membership in CO-OPP.

To fulfill this goal, the Chapter has launched a Membership Fee Match Program. The Program will provide a 50% match (total \$20.00) for either the **renewal of an expired membership**, or for the **initial membership for a new member**. The Program is available from through December 31, 2021.

Participation in this Program can be requested by either an individual who meets the criteria, or an employer who is paying the membership fee for a qualified employee. A regular member with a currently active membership would not be able to "extend" the length of their existing active membership, they would only become eligible if their membership expires during the life of the Program.

As part of eligibility for the Program, requestors will select a committee to join after entering or re-entering the Chapter. You may select one or more of the following Committees as part of your request to participate in the Fee Match Program. You will be paired with a committee of your choosing after your membership application is completed. Information for each committee is available on the <u>CO-OPP website</u>.

UPPCC Certification Digital Badges



The Universal Public Purchasing Certification Council (UPPCC) established a program to provide holders of the UPPCC certifications with a digital version of your certification credentials. The digital image contains verified metadata that describes the qualifications of the certification and the process required to earn them.

The badges can be used in email signatures, digital resumes, and on social media sites such as LinkedIn, Facebook, and Twitter. There is no fee for this service and acceptance of your badges is entirely up to you.

To claim your badge:

Current (non-lapsed) certificants will receive an email* inviting you to accept your badge Click on "Accept your badge" link in the email Create an account at Acclaim using your email address Click "Accept" to accept your badge Start sharing your achievement! Add your CPPO/CPPB to your LinkedIn profile and email signature (Outlook and Gmail), embed it on a website, or share it on your digital resume, Facebook, or Twitter accounts.

If you didn't receive the email from UPPCC, go directly to youracclaim.com and create an account using the same email you use for your MyUPPCC account. Once logged in, you can accept your badge(s).

UPPCC Certification Schedule





The Universal Public Procurement Certification Council (UPPCC) announced new examinations for both the Certified Public Procurement Officer [®] (CPPO[®]) and Certified Professional Public Buyer [®] (CPPB[®]) effective with the October 18-30, 2021, examination window.

The change to the examinations comes after the completion of the most recent universal Job Analysis in June 2020. The examinations are based on the competencies that underpin the profession of public procurement. The CPOO exam focuses on all competencies needed to demonstrate leadership in the six domain areas, while CPPB exam focuses on the practices-level knowledge required to be proficient in this important work.
